Overview of Middle School Social Studies Curriculum

The St. Michael's Middle School Social Studies Curriculum follows the the History-Social Science Framework adopted by the State of California. Content knowledge as well as Current Events and Geography are included in the learning goals. Students utilize technology, reference primary and secondary sources, and engage in debate and Socratic Seminar to expand their knowledge and understanding of concepts presented.
